PARTY TO CELEBRATE CHILD ABUSE & NEGLECT PREVENTION

The Louisiana Children's Trust Fund is celebrating its twenty-five years of child abuse and neglect prevention with birthday parties to be held throughout the state during April, which is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. Each party will feature the community programs supported by the Louisiana Children's Trust Fund, programs which teach parenting skills, provide afterschool support, offer crisis help and more. Civic leaders, and the public as well, are invited to attend the parties and learn more about child abuse and neglect prevention. The new Pinwheels for Prevention campaign of Prevent Child Abuse Louisiana will also be unveiled at the events.

"Child abuse and neglect can be prevented" says Judy Harrison, Director of the Louisiana Children's Trust Fund. "The reasons that parents abuse their children often have to do with lack of support or lack of knowledge. By educating parents about child development, appropriate discipline, safety measures and community resources we can do a great deal to reduce the problem of child abuse and neglect".
